Adults are knowledgeable about early childhood mental health and development and have the skills and mental well-being necessary to engage in responsive, supportive relationships with and on behalf of young children.



The continuum of supports and services including promotion, prevention, intervention, and treatment promotes early childhood mental health by building safe and healthy relationships and environments.



Local and state systems and the people of Colorado recognize the importance of early relationships and prioritize and support early childhood mental health in young children and families.

Infant Mental Health Endorsement (IMH-E®)

- An addition to a person's professional background that recognizes achievement of knowledge and training in the area of infant and early childhood mental health.
- Work specific to infants and toddlers (ages 0-3) and their caregivers.
- The Endorsement is one of the first and most comprehensive efforts in the country to identify best practice competencies at multiple levels and across disciplines and to offer a pathway for professional development in the infant, early childhood and family field.
- The Endorsement is not a license or certification.
- Administered out of the Colorado Association for Infant Mental Health (CoAIMH).

Why is the IMH Endorsement Important to Me & My Professional Development?

- Ongoing training with standards is important to promote consistent, positive practices with young children and their families regardless of discipline.
- Provides information about skills and knowledge that a person incorporates into their profession.
- Provides a framework that tells parents/guardians and other partners what good practices look like.
- Aligned professional standards in the field are more likely to produce a workforce that is prepared and consistent in their practice.

Why is the IMH Endorsement Important to Me & My Professional Development?

- "It hold us to a higher standard; being Endorsed means you may be able to educate families better on infant mental health."
- Having a grounding and being knowledgeable in Infant Mental Health changed the way I work – 180 degrees. Going through the process...refreshed my thinking and re-inspired my work."
- "...with and Endorsement, it guarantees you have a certain amount of experience, training and education, and reflective supervision. You're held to these competencies..."
- "I have noticed the shift that the Endorsement has had in the workforce. People are taking it seriously and using it to plan their professional development and seek out additional skills. It is such an important support for us. Thank you!"

Theoretical Foundations

 Pregnancy & early parenthood, infant development/behavior, cultural competence, attachment, etc.

Law, Regulation & Agency Policy

Ethical practice, agency policy, etc.

Systems Expertise

Service delivery systems, community resources

Direct Service Skills

 Observation and listening, screening and assessment, developmental guidance, etc.

Working with Others

 Collaborating, resolving conflict, etc.

Communicating

Listening, speaking, writing

Thinking

 Solving problems, planning/ organizing, etc.

Reflection

 Contemplating, self awareness, curiosity, etc.

Requirements for ALL Categories / Requisitos para TODAS las categorías

- Training / Entrenamientos
 - 30 hours / 30 horas
- Three Professional Reference Ratings / 3 Referencias



- Documentation of Competencies (Application) / Documentación de Competencias (Solicitud)
- Signed Code of Ethics & Endorsement Agreement / Código de Ética Firmado y Acuerdo de Endoso
- Current Member of CoAlMH / Miembro actual de CoAlMH

Infant Family Associate Requirements

- Education/Work Experience
 Educación / Experiencia Laboral
 - Any academic degree OR Child Development Associate OR Associate's degree OR 2 years early childhood experience (including specific related volunteer experience)
 - Cualquier titulo académico O Asociado en desarrollo infantil O Título asociado O 2 años de experiencia en la primera infancia (incluida la experiencia específica relacionada con voluntarios)



Infant Family Specialist Requirements

Educación

 BA, BS, BSW, BSN, MA, MS, MSW, MEd, MSN, MAS, PhD, EdD, PsyD

Work Experience / Experiencia laboral

(minimum 2 years paid, post-Bachelor's)

- Minimum of 10 families of children 0-36 months
- Primary focus of services is social-emotional needs
- Include attention to the relationships surrounding the child's mental health

Reflective Supervision/Consultation

- Minimum 24 clock hours within 1-2 year time frame while providing services to birth-36 months & families
- RS/C provider must meet requirements for Endorsement at a higher level if not Endorsed

What are my next steps?

- 1. Contact the Endorsement Coordinator
- 2. Register as a CoAIMH Member
- Register on EASy (Category-specific fees)
- Coordinator verifies fees paid and reviews for appropriate level of application
 - Complete required fields re: education, work, and reflective supervision/consultation history as relevant to the level at which you are applying
 - Upload CV/resume
 - Select Endorsement Category
 - Pay Registration Fee
- 5. EASy sends username and password
- 6. Coordinator sends you Next Steps

Endorsement Process / Proceso de aprobación

7. Application preparation / Preparación de la aplicación

 Endorsement Agreement, Code of Ethics, Education, Work, Training, Reflective Supervision/Consultation, References, and Transcripts

8. Documentation of Competencies / Documentación de Competencias

- Match competencies met in areas of education, work, and training
- General Rule: 1 Competency = 1 Hour of Training

9. Matched with Advisor / Emparejado con el asesor

Work in partnership to develop portfolio

Endorsement Process / Proceso de aprobación

10. Submit Application / Presentar la solicitud

- Pay processing fee
- Two Application Reviewers provide review
- Infant Mental Health Specialists and Infant Mental Health Mentors notified of eligibility to sit for exam or deferred based on portfolio review

11. Endorsement or Deferment / Endoso o Aplazamiento

Feedback given on strengths and areas for growth
